Ambeka Rajvanshi is a graduating senior from Lafayette High School. She is a result-driven, performance-oriented, and high-achievement high school senior, who has a proven record of leadership and service to others. Her focus is on biological, healthcare, and medical studies. She has an interest in improving the delivery and reducing the cost of healthcare, to underserved and at-risk populations in the US and in other parts of the world. Her approach includes observing and researching healthcare systems in other parts of the world where complex procedures are performed successfully (at a fraction of the cost incurred in the US), and to cross-adopt the best practices from various healthcare systems.

In order to achieve her goal in the healthcare field, Ambeka has involved herself in a myriad of health-related organizations, activities, and programs.
